

## Variation of Independent Water Networks Limited's appointment to include Dexter's Farm, Huntingdon

On 16 March 2022, Ofwat began a [consultation](#) on a proposal to vary Independent Water Networks Limited's ("**Independent Water Networks**") appointment to become the water and sewerage services provider for a development in Anglian Water Services Limited's ("**Anglian Water**") water supply and sewerage services area called Dexter's Farm, Huntingdon ("**the Site**"). Details of the application and our assessment of it were set out in the consultation document.

The consultation ended on 14 April 2022. During the consultation period, we received representations from three organisations, which are summarised in Section 1 of this document.

We will only make an appointment or variation if our assessment concludes that the application meets the criterion it has been made under; that customers or future customers on the site will be no worse off than if the site had been served by the existing appointee; and if the applicant will be able to finance the proper carrying out of its functions as a water and/or sewerage company. As set out in our consultation we are satisfied this is the case. The responses we have received to the consultation have not changed that view.

Having assessed Independent Water Networks' application and having taken account of the responses we received to our consultation, we decided to grant a variation to Independent Water Networks' area of appointment to allow it to serve the site for water and sewerage services. This appointment became effective on 19 July 2022.

The Site Maps for the variation can be found in Section 2 of this document.

The Variation Notice legally making the variation can be found in Section 3 of this document.

## 1. Responses received to the consultation

We received responses to our consultation from three organisations: the Consumer Council for Water (“**CCW**”), Drinking Water Inspectorate (“**DWI**”) and Environment Agency. We considered these responses before making the decision to vary Independent Water Networks' appointment.

The DWI and the Environment Agency confirmed that they had no comments on the application. The points raised in CCW's response are set out below.

### **CCW**

CCW stated that in general it expects new appointments and variation appointees to match or ideally better the incumbent's prices, service levels and service guarantees. This is particularly true for developments that include domestic housing, as household customers do not currently have the ability to choose or switch supplier like business customers can.

CCW noted that Independent Water Networks proposes to charge customers on the same basis as Anglian Water. CCW is disappointed that this means there is no formal financial benefit to customers having Independent Water Networks as their provider rather than Anglian Water. However it notes that Independent Water Networks currently offers a discount of 2.5% to customers against incumbent company charges and offers discounts to customers who are able to and opt to take up e-billing or direct debit payments. CCW notes that therefore customers will be no worse off in terms of the amount they pay and will potentially be better off than if Anglian Water served them, CCW also recognised that Independent Water Networks generally matches or exceeds Anglian Water's service standards, and so overall CCW supported this application.

However, CCW noted that due to the relatively small size of its customer base Independent Water Networks does not currently offer its financially vulnerable customers a social tariff in the way that Anglian Water does. It noted that Independent Water Networks will, however, offer the standard WaterSure tariff for qualifying customers. It stated that until Independent Water Networks can provide a formal social tariff, it is appropriate for Independent Water Networks to tailor some of its services. CCW stated that it expects Independent Water Networks to offer appropriate and flexible support to customers in financial difficulty who would otherwise benefit from a social tariff. CCW considered that such support should not be at the expense of its other customers. CCW recognised that by matching Anglian Water's charges Independent Water Networks already benefits from the cross-subsidy Anglian Water's customers pay to support its social tariff.


CCW noted our calculation that there should be no increase on the annual water or sewerage bills of existing Anglian Water customers as a result of the variation. CCW stated that whilst it appreciates this, it is unclear if there will be any significant benefits arising from this arrangement for existing Anglian Water customers. CCW questions the value of the NAV regime if it cannot deliver benefits to all customers.

## **Our response**

One of our key policies with respect to new appointments and variations is that customers should be no worse off if a variation is granted. That is, an applicant must ensure its new customers are made no worse off in terms of charges and service than if they had been supplied by the previous appointee. We do not require applicants to better the service and price of previous incumbents.

Vulnerable customers may not be aware of the social tariff that would be available to them if they were served by the incumbent rather than by the applicant. It is the responsibility of the applicant to identify and protect vulnerable customers on the Site. Although the applicant does not offer a social tariff, it should ensure customers will be no worse off.




**DEXTER'S FARM

### 3. Variation Notice

**WATER SERVICES REGULATION AUTHORITY**  
**WATER INDUSTRY ACT 1991, SECTIONS 6 TO 9**

**Variation of the Appointments of Independent Water Networks Limited and Anglian Water Services Limited as Water and Sewerage Undertakers**

Made on 18 July 2022  
Coming into effect on 19 July 2022

1. Independent Water Networks Limited ("Independent Water Networks") and Anglian Water Services Limited ("Anglian Water") hold Appointments as water and sewerage undertakers for their respective areas ("the Appointments").<sup>1</sup> The areas to which the Appointments of Independent Water Networks and Anglian Water as water and sewerage undertakers relate ("Water Supply Area" and "Sewerage Services Area") are set out in their Instruments of Appointment.
2. The site called Dexter's Farm, Huntingdon, which is shown edged in red on the plan attached to this variation, ("the Site") is within Anglian Water's Water Supply Area and Sewerage Services Area. The Site is being developed by Bellway Homes Limited.
3. Independent Water Networks has applied under section 7(4)(b) of the Water Industry Act 1991 ("the Act") for a variation of its Appointment as a water and sewerage undertaker to include the Site and for a consequential variation of Anglian Water's Appointment to exclude the Site.
4. On 27 June 1995, the Secretary of State for the Environment and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly and pursuant to sections 6(1) and 7(2) of the Act authorised the Director General of Water Services<sup>2</sup> to make variations such as those contained in paragraph 5 below. After public consultation, as required by section 8 of the Act, the Water Services Regulation Authority has decided that it should grant Independent Water Networks' application.
5. Therefore, as provided by sections 7(2) and 7(4)(b) of the Act, and with the agreement of Bellway Homes Limited, the Water Services Regulation Authority varies—

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(a) the Appointment of Independent Water Networks as a water and sewerage undertaker so that the Site is included in Independent Water Networks' Water Supply Area and Sewerage Services Area; and

(b) the Appointment of Anglian Water as a water and sewerage undertaker so that the Site is excluded from Anglian Water's Water Supply Area and Sewerage Services Area.
