

Wholesale Retail Code Change Proposal – Ref CPW070e – Phase 4 – bilateral transactions

We are rejecting this Change Proposal on the basis that our decision to approve CPW070f Phase 4 - Bilateral transactions supersedes all changes that were included within this proposal.

Details of the change proposal can be found in the [Final Recommendation Report](#) for CPW070e.

CPW070e proposed the following:

- Codifying the interim bulk submission guidance that was developed to help avoid poor behaviour in stock piling bilateral submissions.
- Clarifications and housekeeping changes.

The solution outlined the need for co-operative behaviour when raising Service Requests in the bilateral hub, ensuring Trading Parties are able to meet Service Level Agreements for such Requests, and to deliver customers a good quality service.

Reasons for rejection:

As stated above, all of the substantive changes to the market codes proposed in CPW070e have now been incorporated by our approval and implementation of [CPW070f](#). Approval of CPW070e would therefore not facilitate the **primary principle** or any of the supporting principles as the legal drafting of CPW070e would bring forward the implementation of the B3 metering processes before they are ready and have been sufficiently tested by the Trading Parties.

Decision notice

In accordance with paragraph 6.3.7 of the Market Arrangements Code, the Authority rejects this Change Proposal.
