

**Storm overflows consultation response- Respondent 1 (09/05/23)**

**Q1: Do you agree with our proposals to set a performance commitment based on average spills, with financial consequences for companies that do not meet their targets?**

No comment received.

**Q2: Do you agree with our proposed approach to unmonitored storm overflows?**

Anglian Water have currently installed only 68% of their required event duration monitors. This slow progress appears to need greater incentives for them to comply. I would suggest a starting point greater than 50 spills is required as the basis for calculation.

**Q3: Do you agree with our proposed approach to mid-period changes?**

No comment received.

**Q4: Do you agree with our proposed approach to emergency overflows?**

No comment received.

**Q5: Do you have any further comments on this performance commitment?**

Although I understand the formal annual reporting for the basis of target calculation, there should be a requirement for 'real-time' public reporting. Recently I requested details of sewage discharges by Anglian Water onto the bathing beach at Mundesley in Norfolk. I was refused this data as they have no obligation to provide it. I was advised to wait until April 2024 when the data would be released in summary form. This, simply, is not acceptable.
